DAY ONE

Start your day strolling the eight-acre greenhouse at **Sunrise Greenhouse**. View an array of annuals, perennials, trees, shrubs, roses, vegetable plants and so much more. Be sure to visit the outdoor display gardens.

Plan to spend your evening under the stars at **Locavore Farm**. This unique farm-to-table dining experience offers guests a chance to slow down with friends, old and new, at their 100-ft. handcrafted table. Enjoy the bounty of Kankakee County's local homegrown goodness, lush surroundings, live music and count on making s'mores around the campfire. Check out the General Store, you'll thank us later. Head back to the hotel to catch some zzz's after a busy day outdoors.

DAY TWO

Rise and shine! You have a full day ahead so fill up on a hearty breakfast at the hotel before heading out.

Your first adventure will be in Kankakee's Riverview Historic District at the B. Harley Bradley House, one of Wright's earliest Prairie Style creations. This fully restored home is nestled on the banks of the Kankakee River and is one of the stops on the state's Frank Lloyd Wright Trail. While you're in the neighborhood, enjoy a self-guided walking tour of the custombuilt, carefully-restored homes or schedule a river cruise on a Duffy electric boat.

Wrap up your morning with lunch at **Jaenicke's Root Beer Stand.** This family-owned and operated root beer stand has kept guests coming back since 1940 with root beer brewed on site. Seasonal hours.

Lights, camera, action! Step back in time with a tour of two iconic theaters in downtown Kankakee. The **Majestic** debuted in 1912 and showcased a host of well-known national and global vaudeville acts. Next, head down the block to the Paramount Theatre. The **Paramount** opened in 1931 and has maintained its art deco heritage with a cobalt blue ceiling and intricate geometric designs in green, red, gold and silver.

Complete the day with a tour of **Restoration Works**. Gayle and her team have been restoring historic windows for well over a quarter century and in 2017, received the Illinois Sustainability Award for the development of the Light Wave Stripper and green restoration practices. Enjoy a relaxing evening at one of the local eateries.

DAY THREE

Before leaving Kankakee County, check out Olivet Nazarene University's Strickler Planetarium or the world-class Italian-built Ruffatti pipe organ at Betty and Kenneth Hawkins Centennial Chapel.
