Greater Kankakee Airport (IKK) is Chicago's Southland's largest regional airport, with the longest runway outside of Midway International, at 5,981 feet. IKK is also home to a state-of-the-art \$65M Illinois Army National Guard Readiness Center and Army Aviation Support Facility.





The private university is consistently ranked as a College of Distinction and in 2021, was ranked as the #2 Best Value Regional University in the Midwest by U.S. News & World Report.

Focused on preparing students for lives of service in meaningful careers in every industry, Olivet has seen strong growth over the last decade, particularly in the Martin D.
